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Tshwane's high water consumption figures continue to rise Erasmia is amongst the

Residents and businesses in Tshwane are warned that if the current high consumption pattern does not change, the city's distribution network may run dry in the next month or two.

This was a message recently put out by the City of Tshwane.

The municipality said: "This behaviour is putting the city's bulk water system under severe strain and may lead to the municipality's system eventually collapsing. The existential problem is not Tshwane's water network, but the indifferent behaviour of consumers, who consistently fail to heed the city's call for water conservation.

"Rand Water has identified Tshwane as the second highest consuming municipality in the Gauteng province. As of last week Monday, 8 September 2025, Rand Water was pumping 926 million litres per day to

Tshwane, when it is supposed to be pumping 662 million litres per day. This is 22% more than the city's permitted limit.

'This high consumption was attributed to 16 of the city's reservoirs which reflected excessively highwater consumption patterns. It is disheartening to note that consumers' behaviour has not changed, despite the city's series of requests to consumers to use water sparingly.

"As of today, Thursday, 18 September 2025, the 16 identified reservoirs are continuing to record even more higher consumption figures. The situation has now been worsened by the addition of four more reservoirs with high consumption figures, bringing the total number of reservoirs with high consumption to 20. The consumption at these reservoirs is outpacing the available supply.

areas supplied by the Brakfontein Reservoir that's understood to have had a drop in its levels.

The City added: "Residents are further reminded that the Level 1 water restrictions that were imposed previously in line with the Water Supply By-laws, were never withdrawn and are therefore still applicable. If the consumption levels continue at this pace, the city will imminently adjust the water restrictions to level 2 or even higher, which will then have financial implications to consumers due to associated change in water tariffs.

"Consumers are thus reminded of the following specific water restrictions: No watering

or irrigation of gardens with a hosepipe or sprinkler system between 06:00 and 18:00. No using of a hosepipe to clean driveways or patios. No washing of vehicles with a hosepipe. No filling or top up of swimming pools or water features. The City urges all residents to make a concerted effort in decreasing the water usage by adhering to the water restrictions. Punitive measures will be imposed against transgressors."

The human rights organization #Africa4Palestine notes and applauds the announcement by Spanish authorities that they will boycott the 2026 FIFA world cup to be co-hosted in United States of America, Mexico and Canada if Israel is to be allowed to form part. Their statement comes shortly after a United Nations report found Israel guilty of the crime of Genocide in its ongoing onslaught on the People of Gaza.

Spanish authorities argue that FIFA cannot allow Israel to be part of the Sport for what they call an 'intolerable' situation in Gaza. The 2010 world champions further call out FIFA's hypocrisy when it comes to applying rules governing the global sport. Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez did not mince his words when dealing with the double standards on the part of FIFA and applying its rules. He said ""The sports organizations should consider whether it's ethical for Israel to keep participating in international competitions. Why expel Russia after the invasion of Ukraine and not expel Israel after the invasion of Gaza? Until the barbarity ends, neither Russia nor Israel should be in any international competition." It is important to note that

it only took FIFA 4 days after Russia's campaign in Ukraine to suspend Russia from all sporting

activities and later removed all Russian football teams from UEFA and FIFA tournaments, solely in retaliation and quoting FIFA fair play principles. In South Africa, the courageous Spanish leaders remind us of our own history and those that gave us unconditional solidarity in several ways including through sports boycotts during our darkest days of Apartheid. The brutal and tragic slaughter of school children in Soweto in 1976, which was at the peak of the Apartheid regime proved to be the final straw for the world football governing body and ultimately expelled and banned South Africa as a member and participant. This followed a series of penalties and suspension that were simply not enough.

We are reminded of the African track and field athletes who refused to participate in the 1968 Olympics because of Apartheid South Africa's presence at the global games. We recall the Rugby boycotts and riots in the streets of London and Auckland that condemned South African Rugby to isolation, Cricket, Boxing, Tennis and other world sporting federations add to the long list of those who refused to be complicit in the oppression of native South Africans by a settler colonial regime. It is this painful and agonizing history that makes South Africans who we are today, a deeply caring society rooted in the spirit of Ubuntu, giving solidarity and empathy without expecting anything in return.

Given our history, it is despicable for the South African Football Association (SAFA) to be silent in the face of gross injustice. It is unfathomable that a country that received overwhelming solidarity in the field of sports, particularly football, will look the other way when the same, if not worse, is happening to others. Palestinians for over a decade have registered complaints to FIFA and on every occasion been ignored or simply dismissed. There's a deliberate ploy by FIFA and its administrators to treat Palestinians as sub-standard members of the global community, a group of people not worthy of equal treatment or fair judgement.

The SAFA leadership must bury their heads in shame for their continued silence on the Palestinian cause in the sporting arena and we should not allow them to use

Three suspects were fatally shot and two others injured during a confrontation with police in Atteridgeville on the evening of 23 September 2025.

According to SAPS Gauteng spokesperson Colonel Dimakatso Nevhuhulwi, the incident followed an intelligenceled operation by the SAPS Highway Patrol, supported by private security companies. The operation targeted a group allegedly linked to a series of hijackings across Pretoria.

"The team was strategically deployed and identified the suspects' vehicle. When officers attempted to intercept it, the suspects fled, resulting in a highspeed pursuit and subsequent exchange of gunfire," said Colonel Nevhuhulwi.

Three suspects were declared dead at the scene, while two

Police responded to an incident of assault in Laudium on 24 September 2025, where a male suspect was allegedly behaving violently and attacking members of the public without provocation.

According to SAPS Gauteng spokesperson, Colonel Dimakatso Nevhuhulwi: "Officers arriving at the scene found the suspect to be a g g r e s s i v e a n d uncooperative. Due to

sustained injuries and were transported to hospital for treatment.

"Police recovered three unlicensed firearms with ammunition, signal jammers, gloves, balaclavas, and the vehicle used by the suspects. Investigations are currently ongoing," added the Colonel.

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The Constitution prohibits arbitrary depravation of property and further stipulates that no person may be evicted from his/her home without an order of Court. For numerous landlords, evictions are perceived negatively and as, nearly unattainable, particularly in the current social and economic factors in society, nevertheless, this perspective is not consistently true. Landlords who are fed up with requesting rent from tenants when it is due or managing troublesome tenants have options accessible to them via the Court. Eviction procedures are governed by the Prevention of Illegal Eviction from and Unlawful Occupation of

Evictions - Leased Properties

Property Act ("PIE Act"). The Court's decisions are founded on the just and equitable criterion.

For a tenant to be evicted, there must exist valid reasons or cause for the eviction. Some common valid reasons are as follows:

- 1. Tenant's failure to pay rent;
- 2. Lease period expires and the tenant fails to vacate the premises;
- 3. Breach of a lease agreement by the tenant:
- 4. Tenant causing damage to the property (does not refer to the wear and tear of the normal use of the property) or
- 5. Tenant is engaging in illegal activities on the property.
- In the event a tenant breaches any

clause of the lease agreement, the tenant must be provided with written notice of the breach and provided with a reasonable amount of time to remedy the breach.

Should the tenant fail to remedy the breach timeously, the landlord is to cancel the lease agreement prior to commencing with the eviction process. It is therefore recommended that landlords have lease agreements in writing.

The eviction procedure entails providing a tenant with a formal written notice to vacate the property, in tenant failing to vacate the property, to proceed to applying to court for an eviction order on notice, attending to service of the notice upon the relevant

parties and further, following subsequent steps until the date of hearing of the eviction. The time to obtain an order of eviction is subject to whether the application for eviction is opposed or unopposed by the unlawful occupiers. Where a tenant has no valid defence, and a subsequent eviction order is granted by the Court, the Sheriff will be authorized to remove the tenant and his/her belongings from the property.

A landlord is compelled to follow the legal process in respect of evictions, any landlord that changes locks, cuts of the tenant's use of utilities or conducts an illegal eviction constitutes a criminal offense and will further cause delays in obtaining an order for eviction. Double-Cab bakkies dethrone German sedans as South Africa's most aspirational luxury vehicles under R1-Million



A significant transformation is reshaping aspirational motoring in South Africa, according to the Cars.co.za Industry Report 2025. The report reveals that the double-cab bakkie has arguably replaced the German premium sedan as the desired status symbol for local automotive consumers, especially in the R500 000-to-R1 million bracket.

Drawing on Cars.co.za's proprietary market data and new-vehicle sales figures, the findings highlight that most motoring consumers now consider modern double-cab bakkies (such as the Toyota Hilux, Ford Ranger, and Isuzu D-Max) as their preferred luxury-vehicle status symbols.

"Our data shows a dramatic shift away from German sedans, such as the Audi A4, BMW 3 Series and Mercedes-Benz C-Class, which dominated the South African luxury vehicle market less than a decade ago, in favour of flagship bakkies," says Alan Quinn, Executive: Product and Partnerships at Cars.co.za.

The Decline of Legacy Luxury Sedans

The shift is starkly evident in sales and demand data. Vehicles previously considered the benchmark for reasonably attainable premium desirability – including the Audi A4, BMW 3 Series, Mercedes-Benz C-Class, and their respective variants – have seen their dominance severely curtailed.

- Disappearance from New Sales Charts: Pricier legacy luxury sedans like the 3 Series and C-Class have nearly disappeared from the top of the new-vehicle sales charts.
- Shrinking Lead Share: In the used market, demand for these sedans, and sedans in general, is declining. The lead share of vehicles like the 3 Series and C-Class has fallen. In 2020 (just five years ago), the 3 Series and C-Class achieved 3.9% and 3.4% of all leads (enquiries) respectively on Cars.co.za. During the first half of 2025, those percentages had shrunk to 2.4% and 2.9%; demand for the A4 declined even further.
- Overall Segment Contraction: The overall sedan segment's lead share on Cars.co.za has shrunk significantly over the past decade, declining from 21.5% in 2015 to 14.33% in the first half of 2025.

This decline is largely attributed to the increasing unaffordability of new luxury sedans, which now compete at a problematic price point (even at base price, before options), driven by macroeconomic pressures like inflation, eroding purchasing power and even manufacturing location. The increase in popularity of the crossover segment and the general

decline in desirability and choice (internationally, too) of the sedan body type are also major factors. "It is also worth noting that while the Hilux, Ranger and D-Max are produced locally, only the C-Class remains in local production among the aforementioned sedans," says Quinn.

The Rise of the Sophisticated Double-Cab

In contrast, the desirability and capability of double-cab bakkies have surged. Double-cab demand has grown substantially, increasing by 71.3% since 2015. As is shown in Cars.co.za's unique cross-consideration charts, the (increasingly sophisticated) double-cab bakkie is now being considered alongside almost every other body type on the market and at nearly all price points, demonstrating its widespread desirability. "Interestingly, the cross-consideration charts suggest BMW 3 Series owners or buyers prefer the Ford Ranger, while those considering a Mercedes-Benz C-Class are increasingly also considering a Toyota Hilux," added Quinn.

Key factors fuelling the double-cab's rise as a luxury replacement include:

1. Increased Sophistication and Specification: South African consumers appear to prefer higher-specification double cabs, reinforcing their status as preferred luxury vehicles. The bulk of double-cab stock on Cars.co.za is priced in the R500k+ price segment, which is about R100 000 higher than the average loan amount approved to finance a vehicle in South Africa, according to TransUnion data.

2. Market Penetration of Automatic Transmissions: Modern double-cab bakkies are increasingly equipped with automatic transmissions to align them with luxury vehicle buyers' and general ease-of-use expectations. The stock of automatic double-cabs on Cars.co.za has seen a near-full reversal in the past decade.

- In 2015, only 25.03% of double-cab stock on Cars.co.za was automatic.
- \bullet Today, that figure has soared to 70.91%, representing a dramatic growth of 183.3%.
- Demand (leads submitted) for automatic double cabs has followed this trend, increasing from 20.59% in 2015 to 57.31% in the first half of 2025.

The sustained popularity of flagship double-cabs from particularly the Toyota Hilux, Ford Ranger and Isuzu D-Max (previously KB) means they are the only "pricey" vehicles (in the used market, Top 25) that have maintained or grown lead share between 2020 and 2025.

Call to ban alcohol alcohol advertising & sponsorship that reaches youth advertising start drinking younger, drink more heavily, and face higher risks of hazardous patterns later in life. South Africa already suffers some of

Amid startling findings about alcohol abuse among youth in South Africa, the Southern African Alcohol Policy Alliance in South Africa (SAAPA SA) has called for a ban advertising and sponsorship that reaches youth.

The Alliance has issued a critical new warning: alcohol advertising is not just selling brands — it is shaping children's behaviour, fuelling underage drinking, and driving lifelong harm.

A statement issued by the Alliance brings together local and global evidence, including the 2025 Planet Youth Survey conducted by the University of Cape Town, which achieved an unprecedented 89% response rate across 49,000 Grade 8 and 9 learners in 123 schools. The findings are stark:

- 40% of learners have already tried alcohol.
- 23% began before age 13.
- 22% drank in the past 30 days; 15% were drunk at least once in the past month
- Alcohol is most often obtained from shops (53%), friends (43%), and family (34%)
- Drinking peaks during public holidays (72%), after exams (51%), and at friends' homes (54%) showing how deeply entrenched alcohol has become in social life.

This local reality is reinforced by international and South African evidence:

- Children exposed to alcohol adverts are significantly more likely to drink (SABSSM 2017 analysis).
- The International Alcohol Control study shows a direct association between adolescent drinking and liking adverts.
- Global studies reveal children are exposed to alcohol marketing every 4–8 minutes in daily life patterns mirrored in South African townships
- WHO reviews conclude children repeatedly exposed to alcohol

advertising start drinking younger, drink more heavily, and face higher risks of hazardous patterns later in life. South Africa already suffers some of the world's highest levels of alcohol-related harm. Statistics indicate that alcohol is linked to over half of violent injuries and 27% of road deaths are alcohol related, with the economic costs running into billions of rands annually.

"Every billboard, sports sponsorship and social media post is an invitation to our children to drink. This is predatory marketing — and its effects are devastating: violence in our homes, blood on our roads, and illness in our hospitals. South Africa cannot continue to let the industry target our children," said SAAPA SA Campaign Director Nomcebo Dlamini, who is also Deputy Chair of the Central Drug Authority.

Dlamini's work with the youth is the catalyst to her consistent pursuance of solutions to the challenges they face including substance abuse, which she sees as the cause of the derailment of many young lives especially in South Africa's disadvantaged urban, periurban and rural communities.

SAAPA SA is calling for immediate government action to ban advertising and sponsorship that reaches youth (billboards near schools, sports sponsorships, online targeting). It also wants to replace industry self-regulation with statutory restrictions aligned with World Health Organisation recommendations and investment in safe, alcohol-free recreational and cultural spaces for youth.

"The science is clear. The harm is measurable. The victims are our children. This is a national public health emergency, and the time for decisive action is now," the organisation said as it embarks on a national awareness campaign that also aims to involve leaders of all faiths in the exercise.

Restrictions

Amid US restrictions, Huawei continues to battle Apple, Samsung and other brands who have America market share.

However, there might be hope after the United States announced a "framework" deal with China to resolve their dispute over TikTok.

US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent announced the agreement after a

second day of talks with Chinese Vice-Premier He Lifeng in Madrid, which also includes discussions about the wider US-China trade dispute which has kept Huawei out of the US markets.

The Huawei Watch has subtle changes. Compared to last year's GT5 series, aesthetically the new wearable has maintained the same shape, albeit new colours like brown and purple

Huawei has been able to deliver significantly better battery life than most Apple/Samsung watches, especially when not using all features at maximum. This is essential when it comes to sleep tracking and Pulse wave arrhythmia analysis which uses high-precision sensor to screen for abnormal heartbeat rhythms.

While Apple, Samsung and other brands lack the battery life, they have a bit more features.

Huawei's watches often have fewer available third party apps, and fewer integrations (e.g. payments, voice assistants) than Apple or Samsung which South Africans have been waiting for. Smart features limitations:

Features like LTE connectivity, contactless payments, local voice assistants are more polished in Apple and Samsung and Huawei sometimes lags in those, depending on region.

Durability

There is also shifting strategy to focus more on durability and resilience is to

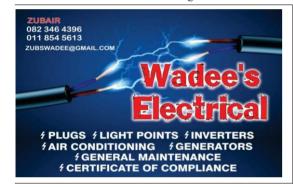
